Academic Awards Program

After COVID-19 sidelined our Academic Awards Banquet in 2020, we were thrilled to host an in-person celebration this May in Tulsa honoring top achieving students and educators in Oklahoma's public schools. "Rising Above, Going Beyond" was the theme for the celebration, which featured an inspiring keynote address by educator Erin Gruwell, co-author of the "The Freedom Writers Diary."



RECOGNIZED 100 outstanding public high school seniors and five exceptional educators with Oklahoma's premiere academic honors. Awarded **\$100,000 in Academic All-State Scholarships**.

Teacher Professional Development

With support from generous donors and educational partners, the Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence encourages and rewards innovation among Oklahoma teachers by supporting quality professional development opportunities.



ENCOURAGED academic success for English learners by providing online professional development, networking and support for more than **800 teachers in 104 districts** through the Teachers of English Learners Program. The program, which is now available to teachers statewide through the State Department of Education, **is boosting the number of ESL certified teachers** by providing a free ESL Certification Test Prep Course.



ENCOURAGED 12 Oklahoma educators to deepen their knowledge and explore their academic passions through Fund for Teachers Fellowship experiences in summer 2021.



ENCOURAGED efficacy and research-based teaching strategies by providing online Foundations of Fractions training to nearly **70 Oklahoma educators**.

Oklahoma School Foundations Network

Under the leadership of Katy Leffel, our Oklahoma School Foundations Network is expanding services and increasing collaboration among Oklahoma's 209 public school foundations. These citizen-led nonprofits serve as a bridge between their community and school district, raising private dollars to complement existing school budgets and building community involvement for the betterment of local schools.
